



West General Robinson Street Garage

The West General Robinson Street Garage is a welcomed addition to the developing North Side of Pittsburgh. It will provide parking that has been permanently lost due to new commercial and residential construction in the area. The garage is located along West General Robinson Street between the Heinz Field home the Steelers and PNC Park home of the Pirates. The garage is tucked in a triangle between the elevated entrance and exit ramps for Route 279 and the Fort Duquesne Bridge.

The 1,233 car capacity garage will be utilized for sporting events as well as weekday commuters. The 10-story structure will include over 5,000 square feet of retail space on the first floor street level. The building was designed to allow the future integrated connection of a light rail “T” station that will connect the North Side with Downtown.

The total precast structure was constructed utilizing 495,897 square feet precast concrete with 1,292 precast concrete components. The load-bearing wall panels have a buff pigment added to the concrete mix and a light sandblasted finish. The design intent was for the structure to resemble an office building rather than a traditional parking garage.
