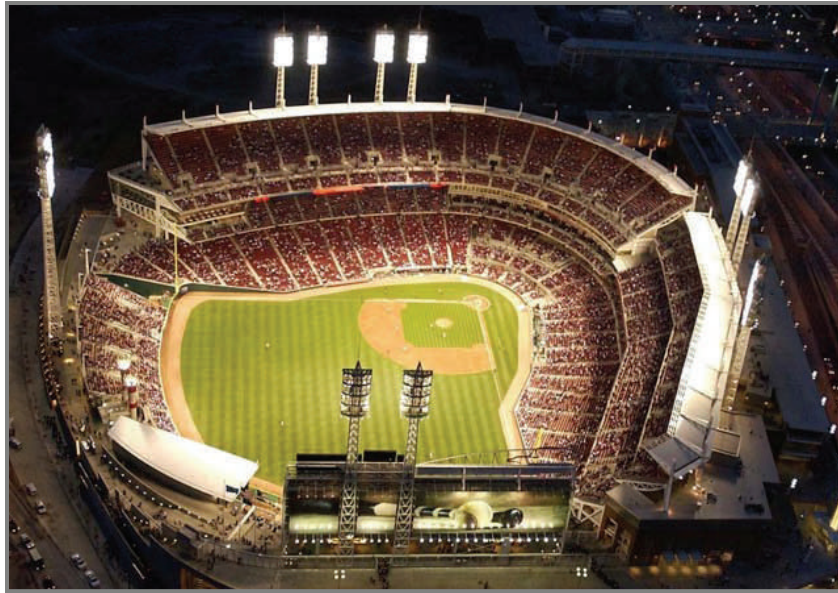


Great American Ball Park

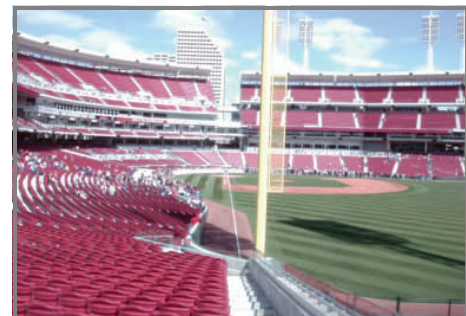
On March 31, 2003 fans at the Great American Ball Park celebrated opening day with the Cincinnati Reds for the first time in their new stadium. Groundbreaking for the ballpark took place on October 4, 2000. Sidley Precast Group is proud to be part of the construction team that included HOK Sports and Hunt Construction Group.

The new stadium was built directly next to the old, now demolished, Riverfront Stadium and is located on the banks of the Ohio River.

The open-air stadium features more than 2,230 precast pieces or over 270,000 square feet of precast components, including treads & risers, vomitory walls, columns and stairs. The ballpark has seating for over 42,000 on three levels.

The ballpark has a “gap” opening in the seating sections located between homeplate and third base. This enables people in downtown Cincinnati to see

into the ballpark. The gap also allows the upper deck to be closer to the field.
